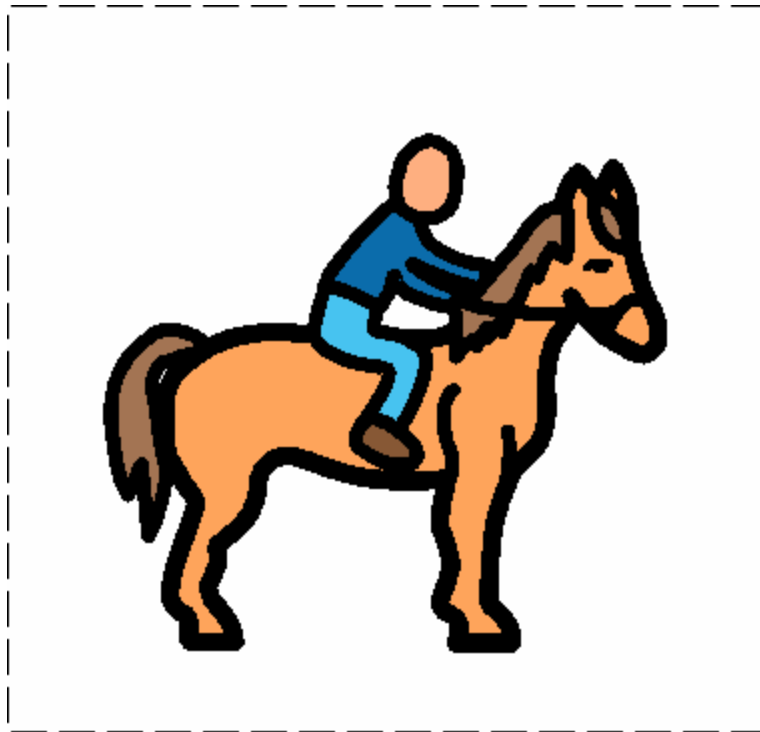
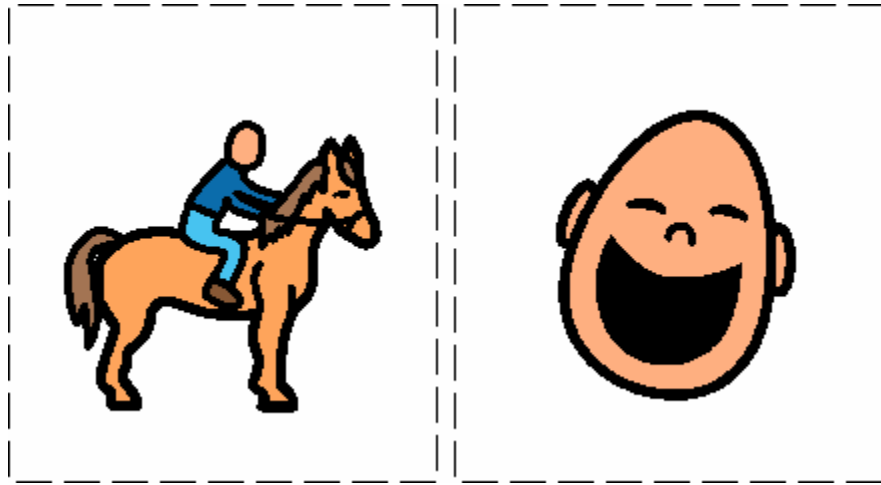
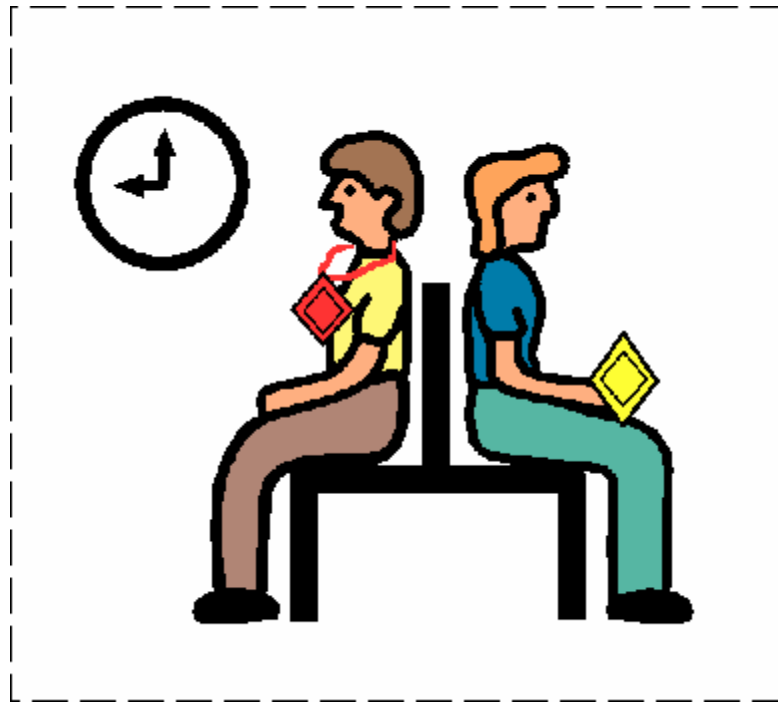


RIDING HORSES AT CAMP

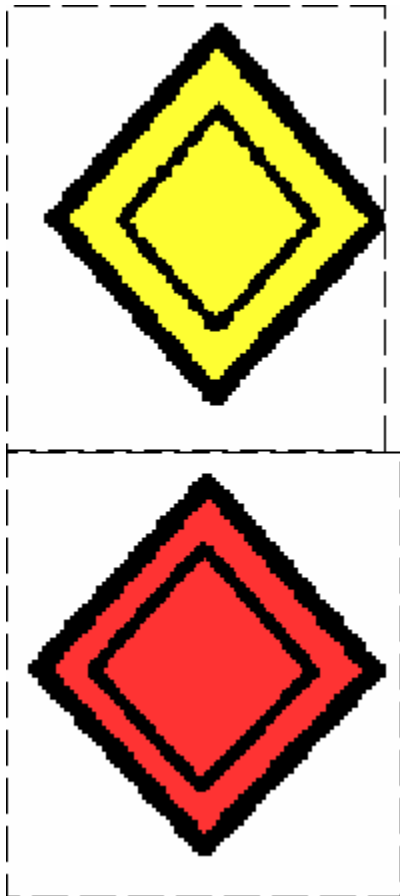




Riding horses at camp is really fun!

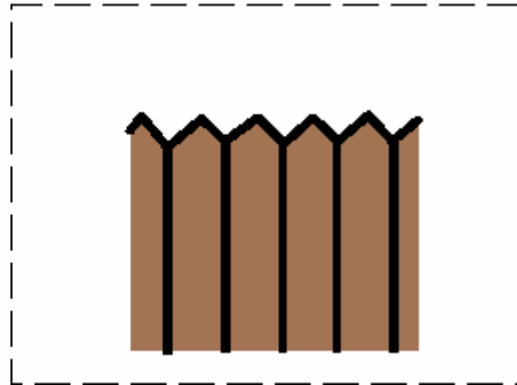
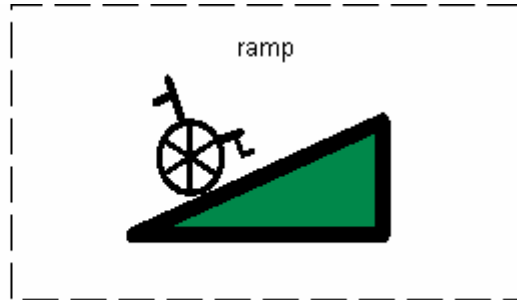
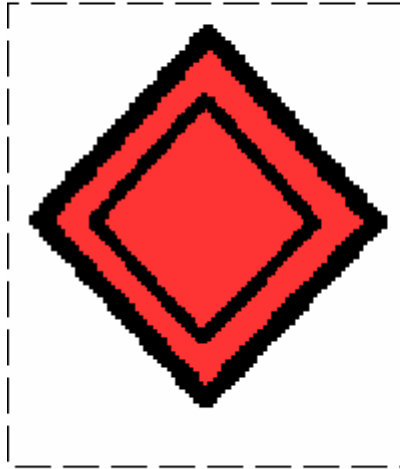


Everybody waits for their turn. We might hold or wear a card that says when our turn is coming.

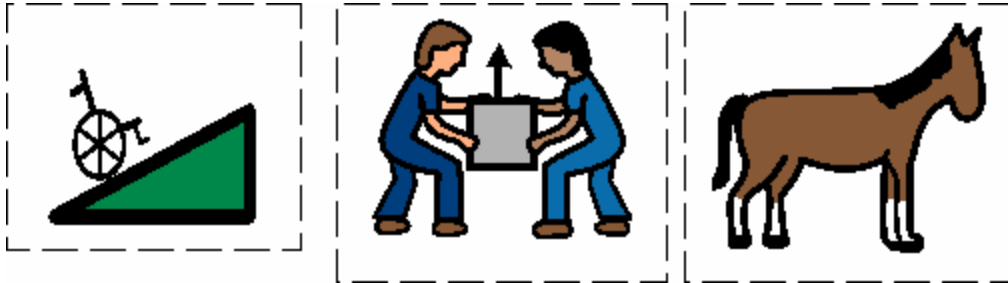


Sometimes the card is yellow. That means I am getting ready for my turn.

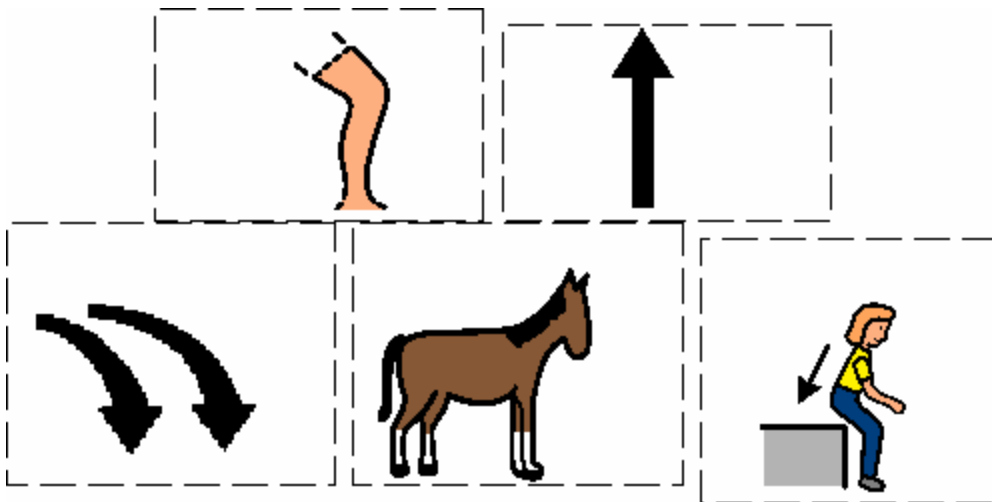
When it is time my counselor will give me a card that is red. That means it is my turn to ride next!



When it is my turn to ride, I will walk up the ramp
or go in the corral.



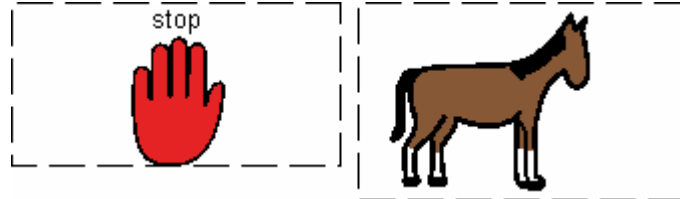
If I go up the ramp, my counselors may lift me up to the horse.



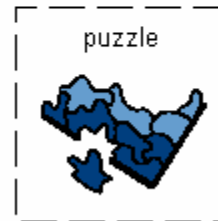
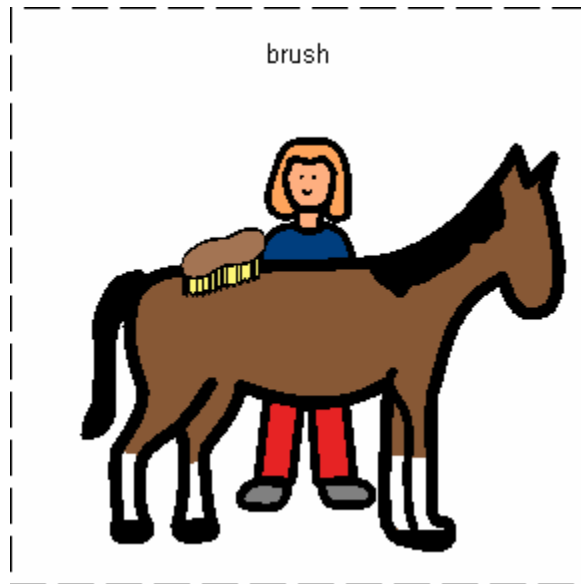
If I mount the horse, I will lift one leg up and over the horse.
Then I will sit down.



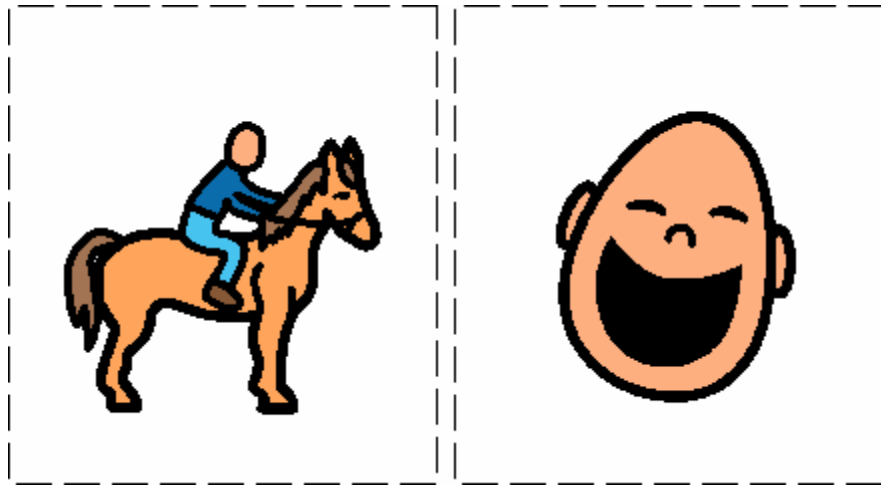
Then I am ready to ride! My counselor and other staff will walk beside the horse and me. They might help me hold on. They will lead the horse.



When my ride is over, my counselor or a staff member will stop the horse. Then they may lift me down, or I may get off the horse myself. If I get down myself, I will wait until my counselor or the staff member tells me it is safe to get down. Then I will lift one leg up and over the horse, and step down.



Everyone will have a turn to ride a horse if they want to. That means everyone will wait while others have a turn. Sometimes we can feed or groom the horses while we are waiting. We might play a game or do a puzzle while we wait.
